I am thinking of trying to find some people who were in Cambridge from Day 1 and are still alive. Last October there was a party for the celebration of my late mom's classmate, Madan Desjardins for her 90th birthday. She is one person whom it would be nice to have next year God willing

As I am reflecting today on my first Advent as young teenager when the Haitian ministry started in 1973, I am bringing the idea of investing financially, intellectually, and emotionally next year in a big 50<sup>th</sup> year celebration. I am one of the rare Haitians who came here in high school, went to college, grad. school, and still part of the Haitian community. I always wonder what if I were allowed and had the support to use in the church a life of learning, what kind of community we would have had. I came to Cambridge 49 years ago today, November 29<sup>th</sup>, 1973. Please help me celebrate 50 years next year in the ministry that my parents and I were part in creating.

I have reread the emails about the 50th anniversary of the Cambridge Ministry that had spread through the Metro North region. Besides a celebration which usually consists of a mass and a reception, I envision a day or 2 with chart papers, power point, small and large groups where people can talk, discuss and look at where we have come in the past 50 years. I am thinking of bringing the elders who have been here since the 1970s. That requires a budget.

Personally I don't have money since I have been out of my tenured teaching job. I spent a life studying Education and religion to realize these are not fields for Black folks. Tenured doesn't mean job security when it comes to K-12 public schools.

In any event, bring this idea to others in the hierarchy. Please forward the thread of my emails to them. I am seeing a budget of 20k at least.

Hi X,

Hope you are staying dry in the last couple days of winter. I left a voice message about a month or two ago about celebrating the 50th year of Cambridge ministry in the 21st century style. Please share with Father H. and other administrative staff. We will need at least 20K for this project. I need an assistant for various reasons. I need to pay couple people to help going through physical albums, take pictures and prepare them for a collage. I will need a video producer to make some productions. I would need to search for others who may have photos. I probably have to fly the 80 and 90 year olds who were younger adults in the 1970s and 80s, pay transportation for those who are still alive, live out of state, and/or live in the area. My friend's mother is 104 years old (Mrs. Prophete is 105 as I am revising this email on November 2023). I hope she'll be alive at the end of the year. My high school friend's wedding reception was at the former Our Lady of Pity church hall. Her mother was the adults of the 1970s when I was a teenager. I got to ask some of my high school friends for their wedding pictures. One of them, her husband died last year. In any event capturing 50 years of the Haitian church history will be a priceless event worth investing in.

Frere G. is sick. He cannot do that much. I don't know how much he can do as he is in and out of the hospital. I have to go his house for things. It's a lot time, experience, education, and knowledge that I will put into this. It's time that I could work another job that I'll put into organizing this special event. I'll be asking around for financial assistance. I am asking the diocese first in case people would ask me if the Cardinal knew about the finance for a 50 year, golden anniversary celebration in a 21st century style. It wouldn't be just a mass and food.

Thank you X. It was great speaking with you as well. It's an overwhelming work to be doing and not having any body to collaborate or talk with. It's hard. Keep working now wasn't my plan. My plan was to take an early retirement to focus on research, writing and producing materials for the Black/Haitian church and children. Things didn't work out this way when I mysteriously lost my tenured teaching job of 27 years.

I think I have said that before. While taking BTI classes at EDS (The Episcopal Divinity School), I was approached by a professor to follow the ordination tract. A Lutheran administrator suggested the same thing to me while taking a class with her at Harvard Divinity. Being a college professor was never in my mind. However, I do similar work that college professors do. I know college professors and doctoral holders who don't do as much writing and producing as I do. In terms of the Haitian ministries, forget it. We don't do that much to show our theological productions and discourse at all. Had I followed ordination tract in the Episcopal Church or the Lutheran community, I would have been able to create, produce and write. In any event, I have started doing a portfolio of my work to share. In case I don't have the chance to formally write books, these samples from the sites below can help one way or another.
